Arabic and Islamic Studies Overview

- All children from beginners to native speakers get the opportunity to study Arabic with us.
- We use a variety of teaching and learning styles in Arabic lessons (group work, pair work, discussions and interactive activities).
- We teach Islamic Studies for Pre-school (FS1) classes native and non-native Arabic Children, Muslims children only to attend.
- Little Haven Nursery does not celebrate non-Muslims celebrations such as Christmas, Muslim Children are not forced to attend non-Islamic ceremonies.

Monitoring of the standards of teaching and learning of Arabic and students work by:

- Creating Speaking and listening activities to develop the children's language skills.
- Enable children to speak clearly and audibly with confidence, fluency and understanding in ways that take account of their learners. Taking into consideration the age/stage of the children.
- Ensure children have a suitable technical vocabulary to articulate their responses.
- Encourage children to listen with concentration and understanding in order to be able to respond appropriately.
- Use classical Arabic in speaking and writing
